

**Minutes of Meeting
Lea County Board of Commissioners
August 18, 2022**

Chair Jackson called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. in the Lea County Courthouse.

Commissioners present were, to wit: Chair Dean Jackson, District 1, Vice Chair Gary G. Eidson, District 3, Commissioner Rebecca Long District 2, Commissioner Jonathan Sena, District 4 and Commissioner Pat Sims, District 5.

Also present were Lea County Manager Michael P. Gallagher II, and Lea County Attorney John W. Caldwell.

Commissioner Sims led the Pledge of Allegiance followed by the Invocation by Commissioner Sena.

ITEM 01: COMMISSION

- Consideration of Lea County Resolution No. 22-AUG-169R Approving the July 14, 2022 Meeting Minutes.

Chair Jackson requested approval and asked if there were any public or commissioner comments concerning this agenda item. Commissioner Sims moved to approve Resolution No. 22-AUG-169R Approving the July 14, 2022 Meeting Minutes. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Long. Secretary polled the Commission. Chair Jackson, yes; Vice Chair Eidson, yes; Commissioner Sena, yes; Commissioner Sims, yes; Commissioner Long, yes. The motion passed.

- Public Comments
 - Senator David Gallegos – Spoke about the Abortion Clinic that is currently targeting Lea County as home for operations and introduced Attorney Mike Siebel who he has contacted to assist with this matter.
 - Attorney Mike Seibel – Introduced himself as an Attorney with Abortion on Trial, a National Abortion/Malpractice Law Firm. He detailed his experience and dealings with the abortion industry, listed the many ways in which an abortion clinic would have a negative impact on our county including the impacts to health care; with ER visits stemming from operations, and the health risk to Hotel owners/employees as some abortions would occur in hotel rooms as a result of the abortion pill. He expressed his intent to assist Lea County free of charge, in preventing the Abortion Clinic from making its home here.
 - Professor Steve Townsend – Hobbs Resident – Spoke about the Fireworks Ordinance. He is concerned with the fact that although most arial fireworks were banned this year, they

were still available for sale within the city, which makes the Ordinance ineffective. He added that his neighbors were actively shooting these style of fireworks well into the night ending at around 11pm of the 4th which was a Monday. His concern is not only the noise but the drought and threat of a house fire should his trees be ignited by one of these. He stated that he had spoken with some city officials that brought it to his attention that the fireworks stands that were selling these were in fact on "pockets of County land" that are not covered by the City Ordinance. He asked that the County Commission work with the City of Hobbs to make sure the fireworks that are banned for use are not sold.

- Caden Jaimeson – Hobbs Resident – spoke in favor of fireworks to celebrate the 4th of July, and proposed a curfew instead of a ban.
 - Beverly Allen – Advisor, Chevron – Introduced Brett Edwards – Chevron, Supervisor Hobbs/Lea County and Michael Moore – Chevron, Field Coordinator – spoke about the current activities Chevron has going on in the County and together presented Lea County Emergency Management Director, Lorenzo Velasquez, a \$40,000 donation for new communication equipment.
 - Kimberly Fields – Lovington Resident – stood up to commend Chevron for their community and employee support.
 - Lea Morgan – Lovington Resident – introduced herself as having a concern, then asked Kimberly Fields to speak on her behalf. Ms. Fields related that Ms. Morgan had concerns about issues with neighbors owning too many animals as compared to the size of their property. Her concerns were proper care for the animals, odor, and possibility of water contamination.
 - Dr. McCleery-former President of NMJC-introduced current President Dr. Moore. He expressed his appreciation and commendation of Dr. Moore. Dr. McCleery handed out pamphlets and explained Higher Ed Bond C, asking the Commissioners for their Vote.
