

**Minutes of Meeting
Lea County Board of Commissioners
October 20, 2022**

Chair Jackson called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. in the Lea County Courthouse.

Commissioners present were, to wit: Chair Dean Jackson, District 1, Vice Chair Gary G. Eidson, District 3, Commissioner Rebecca Long District 2, Commissioner Jonathan Sena, District 4, and Commissioner Pat Sims, District 5.

- Discussion of right to Life. (*Jonathan Sena, Commissioner - District 4*)

Commissioner Sena spoke of being Pro-Life, also spoke about the Dobbs Decision and New Mexico's repeal of the abortion ban. He asked for comments from the audience.

- Caden & Ashley Jameson brought their adopted boy and spoke of only being able to adopt him because the mother was unable to get an abortion due to Ohio laws.
- Ke'Onna Yates gave a summary of her life experience with her oldest child. She then questioned if they had considered helping other less fortunate children in bad environments as well. She later said she wanted everyone to not be afraid or talked into an abortion by anyone.
- Bob Hamilton stated that he was born and raised in NM and had also raised his children here. He gave a synopsis of his grandchild who can't speak but shows so much love with her eyes. He hoped parents would consider alternatives if the doctor is encouraging a parent to have an abortion due to the lack of health of the baby.
- La Void Ford said we have a moral need to save babies, but need a law to back it up. He expressed his appreciation for the county for trying to do this.
- Donna Woodruff wanted to make sure everyone knew that an A topic pregnancy can only be fixed by a chemical abortion. If not, the mother could bleed internally, die of septic or other painful complications. She asked that they not criminalize A topic abortions for the sake of the mother. Please check all avenues and exceptions.
- Kevin Espino asked the commission to please do whatever it takes to protect the lives of babies. He stated that abortion is murder.
- Zach Souter with Legacy Pregnancy Center wants the county use discretionary fund to support foster care and adoption facilities.
- Norbert Rampe from Carlsbad asked that we consider changing laws to keep abortion out of Lea County so we don't become an abortion stop for Texans and Louisianans like Santa Teresa is. He witnessed this for himself while protesting an abortion clinic in Santa Teresa.

- April Daniel said she had gotten pregnant in High School and was made to quit her honors classes. She was shamed by teachers and people who saw her at her job, that she was pregnant at such a young age. She also praised Commissioner Sena who came to the school and talked to her and gave her hope that everything would be ok.
- Chair Jackson hopes all the municipalities in Lea County support and pass ordinances against abortion clinics in their communities.
